Guidelines

Health and Safety:

- No water found on the trails is safe to drink.
 Carry an adequate supply of water with you.
- Dress appropriately for the weather.
- Ticks are common in the area. Check yourself thoroughly after hiking.

Trail Use:

- Remain on trails to minimize impacts on the forest environment. Shortcuts across switchbacks lead to erosion problems and are especially damaging.
- Carry out your trash and any litter you find.
- Blazed trails sometimes traverse private property. Please respect the privacy of the owners and do not trespass.

Restrictions:

- The trails are restricted to day-use only.
 Camping or making fires is prohibited except in the campgrounds.
- All-terrain vehicles (ATVs), motorcycles, and snowmobiles are strictly prohibited on all trails in the park. Mountain bikes and horses are permitted only on designated multiuse trails, such as School Mountain Road and un-blazed woods roads. Please contact the Park for more information.
- The collection of plants is prohibited.
- Dogs are permitted on a leash no longer then 10 feet. Pets are not permitted on beach or picnic areas.
- Hunting is limited to deer (bow only) and spring turkey (shotgun only) in designated areas in season. NYS hunting permits, as well as a Park Permit, are required.
